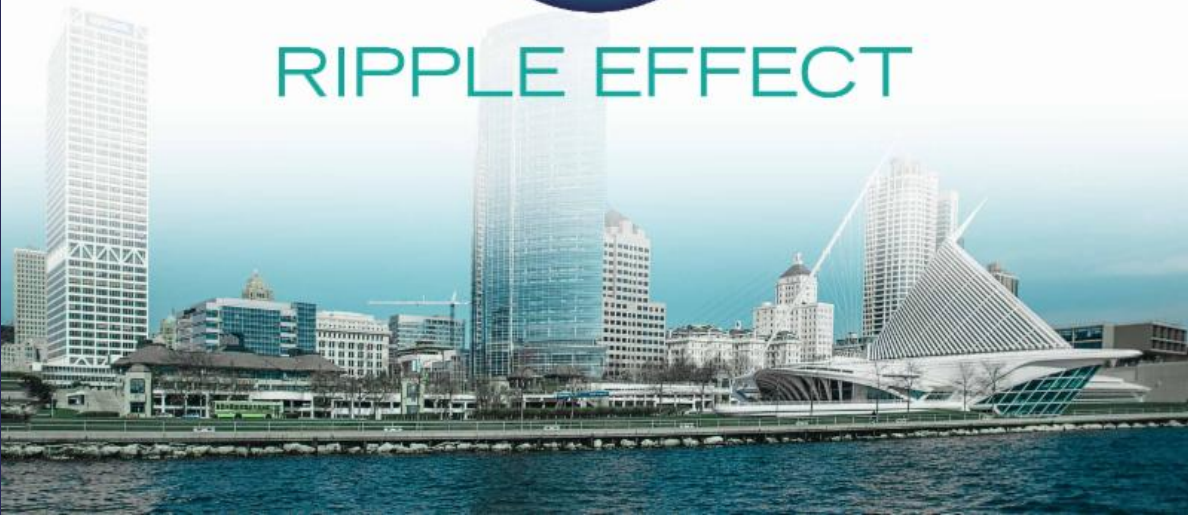

FoxConn Downtown Development Update



Last month, Foxconn made additional headlines as it announced its North American headquarters would be planted in the heart of downtown Milwaukee at 611 E. Wisconsin Avenue. The seven-story, 132,800-square-foot building, which will be renamed Foxconn Place, is being bought from Northwestern Mutual and has the capacity to employ up to 650 individuals.

In addition, Foxconn Place will house the Wisconsin Valley Innovation Center, a hub for the robust 8K+5G ecosystem that Foxconn is creating in Wisconsin and in the U.S. The technology incubator would function as a collaborative melting pot of sorts; a space to blend the newest, brightest minds in the technology field that are getting off their feet. This development encourages creative collaboration, organizational support, and a general atmosphere devised for success and collaboration in downtown Milwaukee's evolving technological marketplace.

Foxconn's 1,200-acre manufacturing complex in Mount Pleasant, which will break ground in late April, is slated to open in early 2019. For more information and updates, click [here](#).
