SCULPTURE MILWAUKEE RETURNS TO WISCONSIN AVENUE

Sculpture Milwaukee, the annual outdoor exhibition of public sculpture on Wisconsin Avenue, kicks off tomorrow, June 7, at 11:30 a.m. with an opening celebration sponsored by Associated Bank. Over 20 works by internationally, nationally and locally renowned artists are on display now through October 27, 2019.

The first 500 guests at the 2019 kick-off event will receive a boxed lunch giveaway catered by 600 EAST Café, followed by opening remarks. After the ribbon-cutting, enjoy live music from Siren, Lex

Allen and WebsterX from New Age Narcissism, plus tours by City Tours MKE.

WESTOWN GATEWAY MURAL BLOSSOMS THIS SUMMER



Milwaukee Downtown, BID #21 and the Downtown Placemaking Task Force have commissioned local artist Emma Daisy Gertel for the new Westown mural at the northeast corner of James Lovell Street and Wisconsin Avenue. The high-impact, west-facing canvas will feature an urban garden as its subject matter--a metaphor for the resurgence in Westown. Gertel will seek input from the community to design the final composition.

Installation will begin in late-June following community engagement sessions at NEWaukee's Night Market on June 12 and at the Westown Farmers' Market. In addition, a virtual community garden will be created to gather suggestions through social media with unique hashtags.

Gertel was selected from a pool of nearly 60 RFQ applications from around the globe. Examples of Gertel's work in the public realm include *In Full Bloom*, 2018 at Black Cat Alley, *Eyes Open*, 2018 at Merge, a local East Side bar, and *Forest Friends*, 2019 at Wisconsin Hills Middle School.



POSTMAN SQUARE OFFICIALLY TRANSFORMS INTO POSTMAN'S PORCH



Earlier this week, Milwaukee Downtown, BID #21 put its "stamp" on downtown's latest revived public space. Postman's Porch, a place where food, music and fun intersect, is officially open at Plankinton, Wells and 2nd Street.

In partnership with neighborhood businesses and residents, this underutilized traffic triangle is transforming into a morning, midday and after-hours meeting spot. Visitors can hunker down

with a book, work remotely, challenge a friend to a board game or dine al fresco with food options from Brunch and Rock Bottom Restaurant & Brewery.

Later in the summer, Postman's Porch Unplugged, a concert series featuring intimate acoustic sets from local singer/songwriters, will take place on June 25, July 23, August 20 and September 24. Guests can enjoy the company of neighbors, live music, and free food and beer samples from Rock Bottom Restaurant & Brewery between 5 p.m. - 7 p.m. Popsicles from Pete's Pop's will also be available for purchase.
