

BEST PRACTICES FOR RIDING DOCKLESS SCOOTERS

Downtown Milwaukee has a new mode of getting around--dockless scooters. Scooter companies Lime, Bird and Spin have begun to pilot their scooter programs throughout Milwaukee. To spread awareness and promote safety, Milwaukee Downtown encourages



pedestrians, riders and motorists to familiarize themselves with these safety tips:

- You must be 18+ years old with a valid driver's license to operate a scooter
- Follow all street signs, signals and markings, and obey local traffic laws
- Helmet use is encouraged while riding a dockless scooter
- Sidewalk riding is prohibited
- Riding and parking on the Riverwalk is prohibited
- Only one rider per scooter
- Use caution at crosswalks
- No one-handed rides
- Do not use headphones while riding
- Do not ride if you've consumed alcohol
- Scooters must be parked responsibly
- Park out of the public right of way--keep walkways, driveways, access ramps, and fire hydrants clear
- Park close to the curb, facing the street near designated bike or scooter parking areas, trees or street signs
- Make sure kickstand is securely in the down position so that the scooter stays upright
- Avoid uneven surfaces like grass, gravel, rocks, or inclines
- Except at permitted bicycle facilities, dockless scooters cannot be parked within the following locations:
 - Parklets
 - Loading zones
 - Accessible parking spaces
 - Curb ramps
 - Entryways
 - Driveways
 - Street furniture requiring pedestrian access
 - Transit stops, including bus stops, streetcar stops, shelters, and passenger waiting areas
